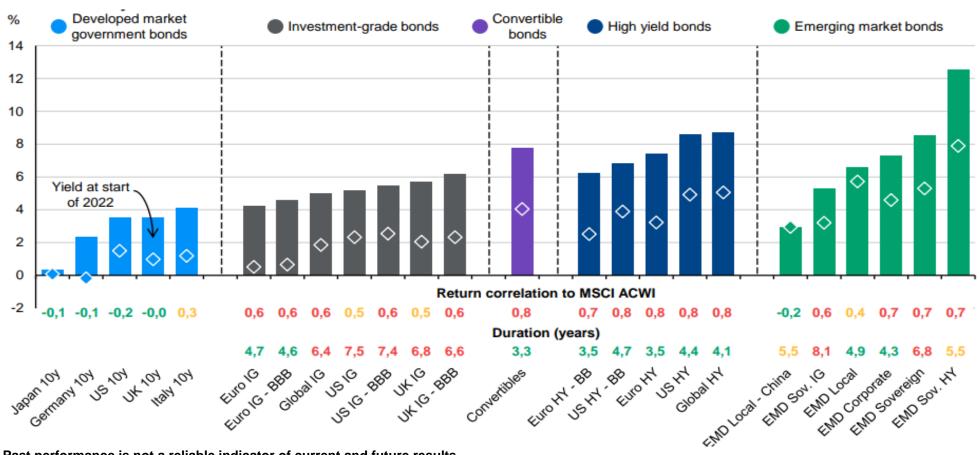

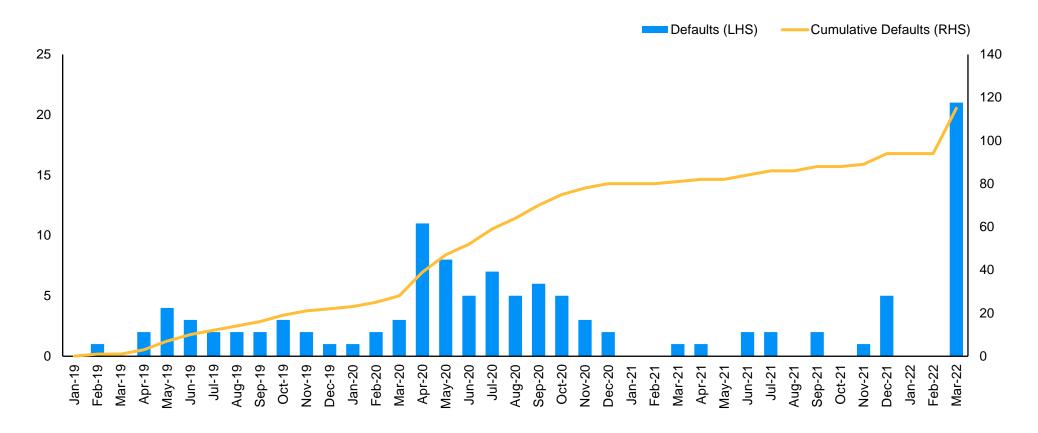

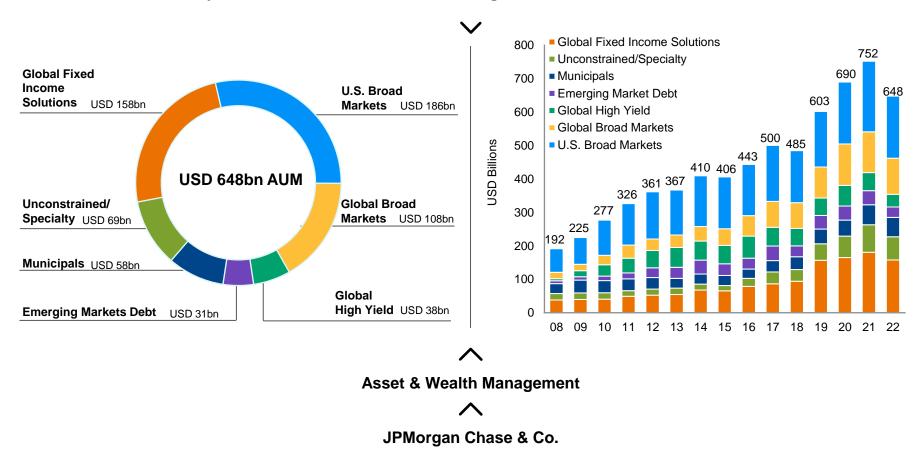

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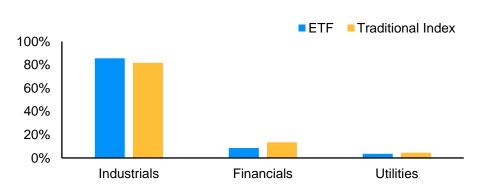

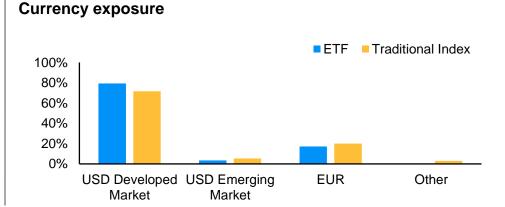

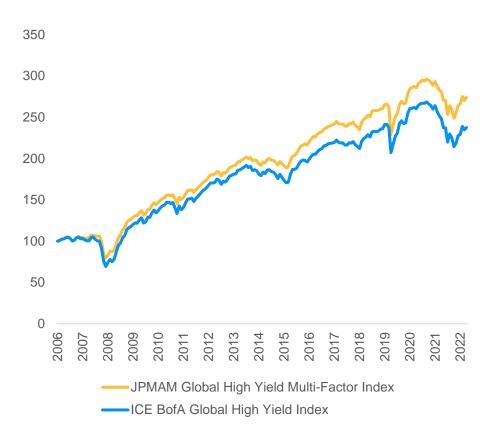

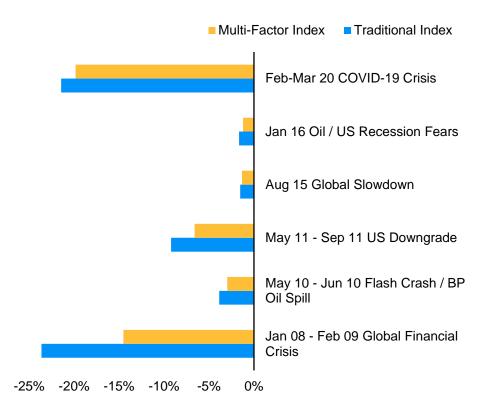

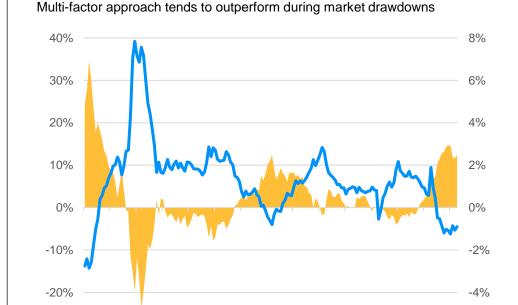

Excess Returns: Multi-Factor Index (RHS) ——Traditional Index



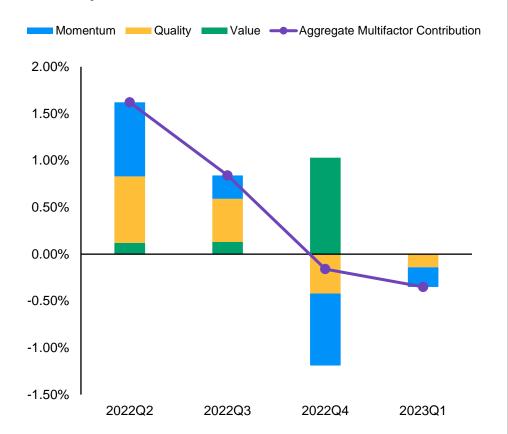

Comments

Multi-Factor: Despite concerns regarding continued elevated inflation and a potential economic recession on investors' minds, the ICE BofA Global HY Index (USD, unhedged) returned 3.59% during Q1 2023. For the second quarter in a row credit factors underperformed the market weighted benchmark, by -0.35% over Q1 2023. The rolling 12 month outperformance of 2.11% highlights the advantage of our multi-factor approach in terms of stability and robustness through the cycle.

Quality: A continuation of last quarter's theme, companies that scored well on our quality factor (those with strong fundamentals and low market beta) underperformed in the most recent quarter.

Value: The value factor was the best performer within multifactor during the quarter on the backdrop of strong market performance.

Momentum: Momentum was the biggest detractor, with a second straight negative quarter in Q1 2023.

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Value investing in Credit Markets

Intuition:

Companies that are relatively underpriced given their fundamental financials tend to outperform

Economic Rationale:

Over-extrapolation of growth trends and/or greater default risk

Metrics Considered:

Market measure of value (spread) relative to a fundamental measure of value (default risk or debt to earnings ratio)

Results:

Higher value companies tend to generate higher returns and a better Sharpe Ratio than lower value companies, though we do see higher risk associated with higher returns

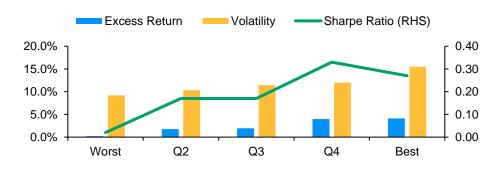

Securities with positive recent performance continue to outperform, and vice versa

Economic Rationale:

Behavioural bias; Structural distinction between investment grade and high yield investors

Metrics Considered:

Credit momentum; Equity momentum

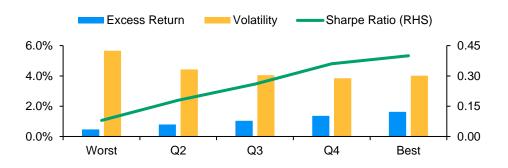
Results:

Within both Credit and Equity momentum, we see an increase in return alongside a decrease in risk as we move along quintiles, with similar results from the composite approach

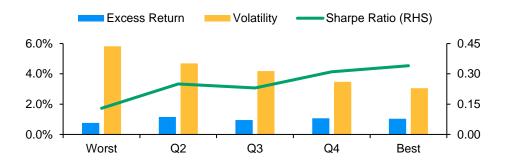

Results: Quality in High Yield (2000 - 2022)

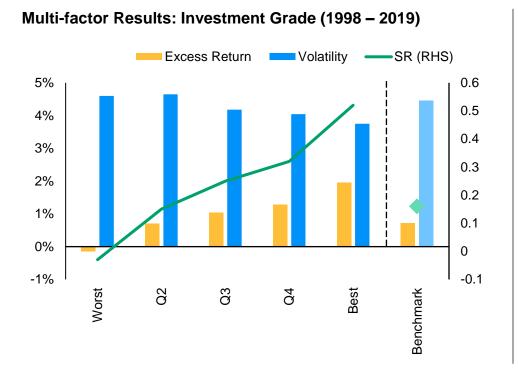


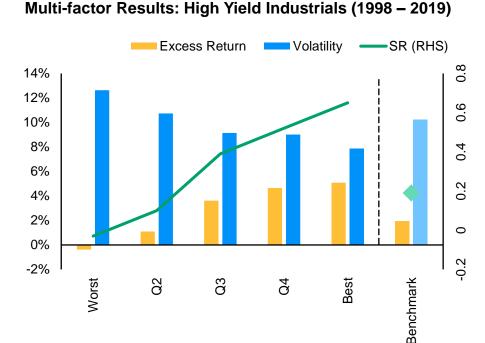

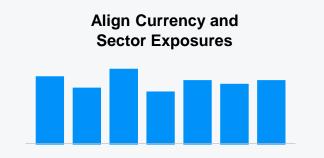

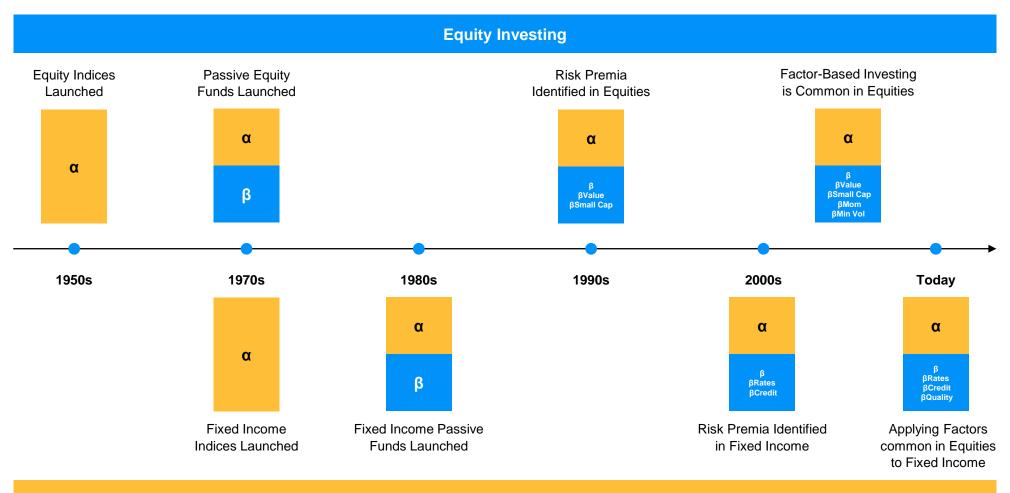
